To prepare for Sunday Mass it is a good idea to read and give thought to the readings in your missal or Bible. Here are some questions to ponder.

First Reading [Exodus 17:3-7] In the desert, filled with thirsty panic, the Israelites grumbled that God was not with them. Can you relate to this situation in some way?

Second Reading [Romans 5:1-2, 5-8] St Paul says, "The Holy Spirit has been given to us." What do these words mean to you? How often do you call on this Spirit?

Gospel [John 4:5-42] "If you only knew what God is offering" What is God offering you? Will you accept it?

THE NEED TO FORGIVE

It is not easy to ask for forgiveness or even to admit that we are in the wrong and our first reaction is not always our real one. Sometimes in a flash of anger it is possible to say something or do something which we regret afterwards. But far more important than that is our ongoing willingness to forgive or to ask forgiveness.



This can be difficult even though we know it is important. It is an essential part of Christ's teaching. In fact, it is true to say that the very reason why God became human was to bring forgiveness to the world. Forgiveness in two ways: we need to be forgiven and we need to forgive other people.

It is not easy but the first step must be a genuine wanting to forgive. Sometimes when a person comes asking for help and I ask if they really want to forgive, the answer can be "Sometimes I do, but I'm afraid sometimes I don't." More often the answer is, "Yes, I do want to forgive, I really do. But I just can't let go of it. It seems to have a hold on me." It takes time to get there – human beings need time to grow. The first essential step is still to *want* to forgive, but after that it may take some time to feel it and to know that I have let go of it.

One thing you will find helpful is to read accounts of people who after being viciously hurt have come to real forgiveness. The book Bishop Jason has given us, *Everybody Needs to Forgive Somebody* is just that - stories of the extraordinary generosity of people who have been hurt. The need to forgive and let go of hurt is absolutely essential. Jesus' whole mission was to forgive.


