
Barbados Pilgrims of Hope

Jubilee Opening Ceremony and Mass Sunday 29th December 2024 (Feast of the Holy Family)

The Church entered its Jubilee year as "Pilgrims of Hope", with a procession beginning at the Golden Square Freedom Park in Bridgetown. Led by Bishop Neil Scantlebury, parishioners singing in chorus, processed to St. Patrick's R.C. Cathedral to celebrate the Holy Eucharist and the Opening Mass of the Jubilee.



The Holy Door



On Christmas Eve, Pope Francis opened the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica, officially inaugurating the 2025 Jubilee. After the first 50 pilgrims, who made the pilgrimage at the opening rite, following the Pope, approximately 35,000 pilgrims passed through the Holy Door on Christmas Day. From 8am on December 25, the pilgrimage to the Door of St. Peter was open to everyone.

From a symbolic viewpoint, the Holy Door takes on a special significance: it is the most powerful sign of the Jubilee, since the ultimate aim of the pilgrim is to pass through it. The opening of the door by the Pope constitutes the official beginning of the Holy Year.

Passing through the Holy Door expresses the decision to follow and be guided by Jesus, who is the Good Shepherd. The door is a passageway that ushers the pilgrim into the interior of a church. For the Christian community, a church is not only a sacred space, to be approached with respect, with appropriate behavior and dress code, but it is a symbol of the communion that binds every believer to Christ: it is a place of encounter and dialogue, of reconciliation and peace which awaits every pilgrim, the Church is essentially the place of the community of the faithful.

THE IMPORTANCE OF A JUBILEE

Why is the jubilee such an important event for Catholics? The answer is simple: It offers an extraordinary opportunity to attain salvation and experience that God's holiness can transform us.

Ultimately, it is a gift that helps us reach heaven.

Why? Because it makes available to the faithful all the easy means to obtain benefits from the "treasury" of the Church, for example, a plenary indulgence, which returns the soul to the state it was in when it received baptism.




Requirements to obtain the Jubilee plenary indulgence

To obtain the Jubilee indulgence it is important to know the requirements of how the indulgences are granted and where they are granted. With the arrival of the Jubilee of Hope, the Vatican noted the three usual conditions:

"All the faithful, who are truly repentant and free from any affection for sin, who are moved by a spirit of charity and who, during the holy year, purified through the sacrament of penance and refreshed by holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the supreme pontiff, will be able to obtain from the treasury of the Church a plenary indulgence, with remission and forgiveness of all their sins, which can be applied in suffrage to the souls in purgatory," the document states.

Sacred Sites



The Bishop chooses the sacred sites according to the Code of Canon Law. The blessing of churches is reserved to the Diocesan Bishop. The Bishop can delegate another priest for this purpose.




Can. 1205 Sacred places are those which are designated for divine worship or for the burial of the faithful by a dedication or a blessing which the liturgical books prescribe for this purpose.

Can. 1206 The dedication of any place belongs to the diocesan bishop and to those equivalent to him by law; they can entrust the function of carrying out a dedication in their territory to any bishop or, in exceptional cases, to a presbyter.

Can. 1207 Sacred places are blessed by the ordinary; the blessing of churches, however, is reserved to the diocesan bishop. Either of them, moreover, can delegate another priest for this purpose.

Visit a Sacred Site and Gain a Plenary Indulgence

Bishop Neil Scantlebury, Roman Catholic Bishop of Bridgetown announced that the Year of the Jubilee Sacred Sites chosen would be St. Patrick's R.C. Cathedral, in the Parish of St. Michael and Our Lady of Sorrows, in the Parish of St. Peter.



HOW DO YOU GAIN YOUR INDULGENCES DURING THE YEAR OF THE JUBILEE

To gain indulgences during the Year of the Jubilee 2025, you can do the following:

- Make a pilgrimage.
- Perform Works of Mercy.
- Visit any of the two Sacred Sites.
- During the Year of the Jubilee 2025, the faithful can obtain up to two plenary indulgences per day for the souls of the faithful departed.


Father in heaven



Did You Know?

That during the Year of the Jubilee all debts were forgiven. During this Year of the Jubilee, let us examine our hearts to see who we need to forgive and with whom we need to be reconciled. Remember, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is always available.



The theological language of indulgences and its relationship to confession can be both intimidating and heavy to unpack and so here is a good everyday analogy by Fr. Andrew Hart is a priest of the Diocese of Little Rock, explained in his own words.

"If you lend me your car so I can go to work, but I go joy-riding instead and bust up the fender, then I need to do two things as a result. I have to ask first for your forgiveness. But even after you forgive me, I still need to make up for the damage to your car that I have caused. In a somewhat analogous way, we could say that the temporal punishment is what we still have to make up in our relationship to God for the sins for which he's forgiven us. An indulgence is a special spiritual favor from the Church that helps us atone for that in this life rather than after death."
